<p>The Tri-County Board of Recovery and Mental Health Services is dedicated to planning, funding, monitoring and evaluating substance abuse and mental health services for Darke, Miami and Shelby counties; working diligently to see that the services are cost-effective and of the highest possible quality; informing the community about these services; and access to them.</p>		
<p>If the Tri-County Board of Recovery and Mental Health Services adopts, embraces, and supports a prevention infrastructure that includes a highly qualified prevention workforce and high-functioning community coalitions to implement effective, evidence based strategies ... <i>then</i> the communities in Darke, Miami, and Shelby Counties will experience a planned sequence of culturally appropriate, science-driven strategies intended to reduce the likelihood of or delaying the onset of behavioral health problems (i.e., substance abuse, mental illness, suicide, and problem gambling).</p>		
<p><u>Workforce Development</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 25% of the prevention workforce in the Tri-County Board Area have the Ohio Certified Prevention Assistant, Specialist, and/or Consultant credentials. 25% of the prevention workforce in the Tri-County Board Area have the Ohio Early Childhood Mental Health Professional Credential. 0% of the prevention workforce in the Tri-County Board Area have the Ohio Youth Prevention Leadership Certification. <p><u>Community Coalitions</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> There are 2 community coalitions addressing substance abuse prevention in the Tri-County Board Area. 0% of the community coalitions have had formal training and/or technical assistance in coalition development, structure and function. <p><u>Evidence-based Programs, Policies, and Practices</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In SFY14, 41.7% of the prevention programs funded by the Tri-County Board of Recovery and Mental Health Services were model programs, 12.5% were adapted programs, and 45.8% were local programs. In SFY14, 32.6% of the prevention strategies funded by the Tri-County Board of Recovery and Mental Health Services were information dissemination, 4.1% were community-based process, 8.2% were problem identification and referral, 10.2% were alternative activities, 42.9% were prevention education, and 2.0% were environmental strategies. (Note: Programs could utilize more than one strategy, the denominator (N = 49) is the total number of strategies submitted into POPS.) There is one (1) established youth-led, adult guided prevention programs in the Tri-County Board Area. 	<p><u>Workforce Development</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Support prevention personnel in the Tri-County Board Area as they work toward OCPS certification by encouraging providers to have professional development plans that include expenses for providing training that contributes to, and the application fee for, the Ohio Certified Prevention Assistant, Specialist, and Consultant credentials; the Ohio Early Childhood Mental Health Professional Credential, and/or the Ohio Youth Prevention Leadership Certification. Host continuing education opportunities for prevention personnel and community members in the Tri-County Board Area to earn RCHs necessary to attain or maintain OCPS certification. <p><u>Community Coalitions</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Support coalition development in the Tri-County Board Area by encouraging providers to have coalition development plans that include expenses for providing training or technical assistance in coalition development, structure, and function. <p><u>Evidence-based Programs, Policies, and Practices</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Support the implementation of evidence-based programs, policies, and practices by setting guidelines regarding the distribution of model, adapted, and local programs for providers using SAPT Block Grant Prevention Funding; with emphasis placed on model programs when appropriate. Utilize data and information from a comprehensive needs assessment to create a comprehensive prevention approach in the Tri-County Board Area that utilizes the 6 CSAP Prevention Strategies in appropriate proportions. Support the implementation of high quality youth-led, adult-guided prevention programs by setting guidelines for the development of the programs that is consistent with the aims of the Ohio Youth-led Prevention Network. 	<p><u>Workforce Development</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 75% of the professional prevention workforce in the Tri-County Board Area will have the Ohio Certified Prevention Assistant, Specialist, and Consultant credentials; the Ohio Early Childhood Mental Health Professional Credential, and/or the Ohio Youth Prevention Leadership Certification. Those prevention professionals who do not have the Ohio Certified Prevention Assistant, Specialist, and Consultant credentials; the Ohio Early Childhood Mental Health Professional Credential, and/or the Ohio Youth Prevention Leadership Certification will have documented evidence that they are working toward certification. 100% of prevention providers will have workforce development plans in place that encourages their professional prevention workforce to attain or maintain OCPS certification. <p><u>Community Coalitions</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Development of a coalition in each of the counties in the Tri-County Board Area. 100% of community coalitions in the Tri-County Board Area will have formal training and/or technical assistance in coalition development, structure and function. <p><u>Evidence-based Programs, Policies, and Practices</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The standard for identifying and selecting evidence-based interventions in the Tri-County Board Area will be the SAMHSA Criteria¹. Creation of a policy/best practices statement regarding the distribution of model, adapted, and local programs for providers using SAPT Block Grant Prevention Funding; with emphasis placed on model programs when appropriate. Creation of a comprehensive prevention approach for the Tri-County Board Area that emphasizes prevention education and environmental strategies as the two main prevention strategies, with the other four CSAP strategies² in a supporting role. Development of a youth-led, adult-guided prevention group in each of the counties in the Tri-County Board area that has a scope consistent with the aims of the Ohio Youth-led Prevention Network³.
